The Bachelor of Science in Psychology provides theoretical and applied understanding of psychological principles to prepare you for graduate study in psychology, entry-level positions in the helping professions, or careers requiring a psychology background. Biblical coursework enables you to apply psychological principles from a Christian perspective.

Highlights

- Through the degree's Marriage and Family concentration, you will examine foundations for family communication, problem solving and relationships, as well as counseling and intervention strategies.
- Take select concentration courses for graduate credit toward a Master of Arts in Human Services (*Graduate tuition applies*).
- View people and the practice of psychology through a biblical, Christ-centered worldview not found in secular psychology programs.
- Learn from faculty who are both educators and practitioners in the field of psychology.
- Blended learning format.
